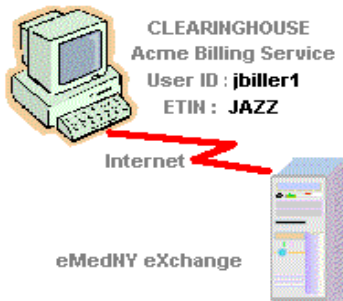


# EMedNY eXchange Used in Example to Retrieve 835 Remittance

## Example Uses Multiple Claims Submission Sources

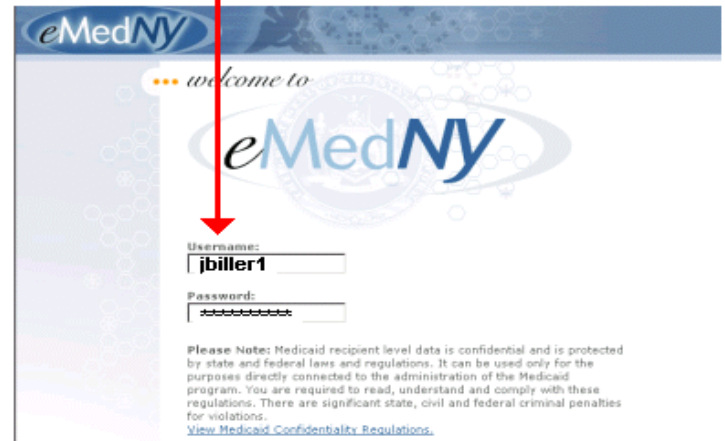


●eXchange may be used to submit claims and to retrieve remittances OR just to submit OR just to retrieve!

●The entity that retrieves the remittance is not necessarily the entity that submits the claim.

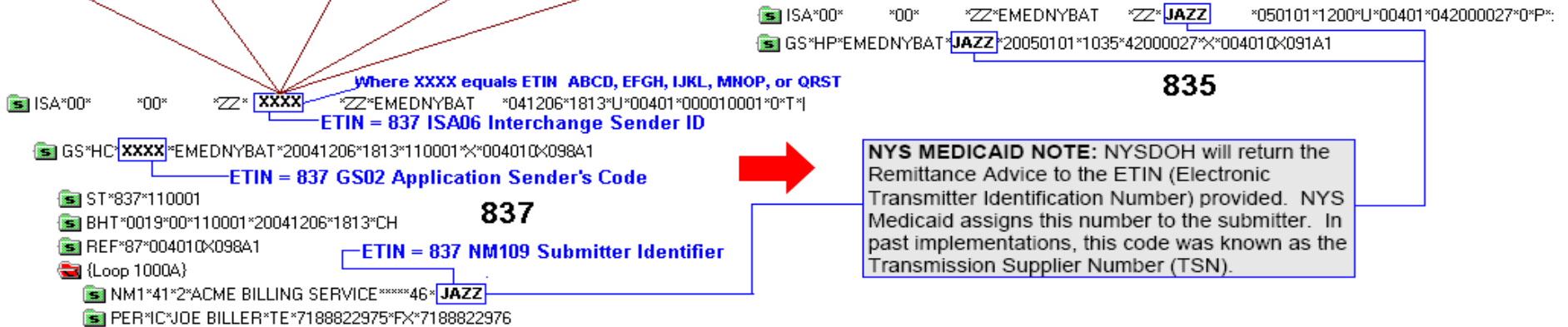
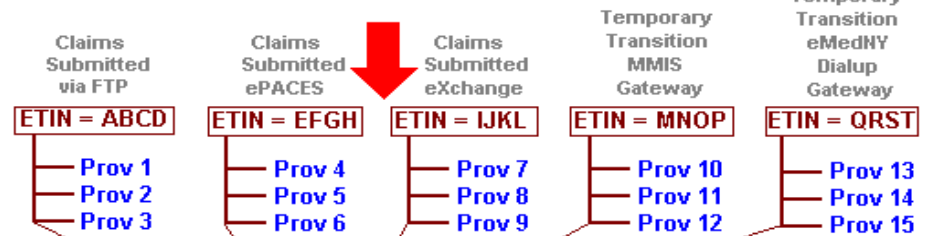
### Retrieve 835 via eXchange EXAMPLE

Acme Billing Service (ETIN = JAZZ) will select the 'eXchange' button at <http://www.emedny.org>, and enter the User ID 'jbiller1' and password obtained via ePACES enrollment. jbiller1's mailbox will contain remittances for previously submitted 837's that contained Acme Billing Service's ETIN (JAZZ) as the 837x 1000A NM109 Submitter Name Primary Identification Number as seen in the 837P example below. This ETIN (JAZZ) from the 837x 1000A NM109 becomes the Response File's GS03 Application Receiver's Code and the ISA08 Interchange Receiver's ID.



### Possible 837 Submission Sources

Various Interchange Senders - Same 1000A NM109 JAZZ



**NYS MEDICAID NOTE:** NYSDOH will return the Remittance Advice to the ETIN (Electronic Transmitter Identification Number) provided. NYS Medicaid assigns this number to the submitter. In past implementations, this code was known as the Transmission Supplier Number (TSN).
