Announcement of Requirement for Certified ETIN on All Batch Submissions

Certified ETINs Required for all Types of ASC X12 Version 5010 Electronic Batch Submissions into the eMedNY System

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PLEASE NOTE: Submitters of all types of 5010 batch transactions to eMedNY, including 270 and 278 transactions, are required to reference a certified Electronic Transmitter Identification Number (ETIN) in their submissions. This requirement does not apply to real time transactions, such as POS terminals, telephone (ARU), or ePACES Real Time. Please refer to the following statement:

"ETIN/Submitter Information — With the implementation of ASC X12 version of 5010, a certified Electronic Transmitter Identification Number (ETIN) is required for all electronic submissions into the eMedNY System. This requirement includes the 270 Eligibility and the 278 Prior Approval transactions. When the submitter is a Provider, the ETIN in the GS02 must be certified to the submitted provider NPI (or MMIS for atypical providers) in the NM109 segment. When the Submitter is not a Provider, the ETIN in GS02 must be certified to the 8 digit MMIS Submitter ID in REF02. Refer to the Trading Partner Information Companion Guide for more detailed information."
