With **less than 40 days to go** before ICD-10 compliance rules go into effect, <u>www.eMedNY.org/icd</u> has been updated with a variety of new coding resources to assist providers in their transition, including links to:

- CMS's complete list of the 2016 ICD-10-CM valid codes and code titles
- Resources for unspecified codes and how they should be used from Medicaid Learning Network Matters[®] and CMS and
- Ways to keep up to date with CMS's information on ICD-10 via the web, email and twitter

All Providers: Review the <u>FAQs</u> to see how your NY Medicaid claims will need to be submitted.

Electronic Claims Submitters: After researching applicable ICD-10 codes and making sure that your software submits the appropriate Code List Qualifier Code that designates either ICD-9 or ICD-10 diagnosis codes are on the claim, do not hesitate to **test using eMedNY's Provider Test Environment** with the detailed instructions on emedny.org: https://www.emedny.org/Notice/ICD_10_7-8-14.pdf.

Paper and ePACES Claims Submitters: eMedNY does not provide a method to test claims submitted with these methods. ePACES features an ICD Version radio button which you will be required to select after October 1. This field currently defaults to ICD-9 as shown in our <u>ePACES Claim Quick Reference Guides</u>.
