All Providers: Review the <u>FAQs</u> to see how your NY Medicaid claims will need to be submitted.

Electronic Claims Submitters: After researching applicable ICD-10 codes and making sure that your software submits the appropriate Code List Qualifier that designates either ICD-9 or ICD-10 diagnosis codes are on the claim, do not hesitate to test using eMedNY's Provider Test Environment. Paper and ePACES Claims Submitters: eMedNY does not provide a process to test claims submitted with these methods. ePACES features an ICD Version radio button which you will be required to select starting October 1. This field currently

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defaults to ICD-9 as shown in our <u>ePACES Claim Quick</u> <u>Reference Guides</u>.

Submitters using Vendors, Clearing Houses and Service Bureaus: Be sure to communicate with your vendors to understand what steps you will need to complete to be ready on October 1 and coordinate testing in eMedNY's Provider Test Environment.

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
