Attention Pharmacy Providers- Important Information Regarding Drug Shortages as of 4/30/20

Updates are highlighted

Due to reported market shortages and allocation constraints, Medicaid Fee for Service (FFS) has relaxed prior authorization for certain drug(s)/drug classes to ensure access to necessary medications during the Declared Disaster Emergency in NY.

- ProAir HFA is a preferred product in the Inhaled Short-Acting Beta2 Adrenergic Therapeutic Class. If this product is not available, the following drugs are available without PA:
 - albuterol HFA, levalbuterol HFA, ProAir Digihaler & RespiClick, Proventil HFA, Ventolin HFA and Xopenex HFA (change made effective 3/19/20)
- Generic azithromycin tablets are preferred over the brand products per substitution law. If this product is not available, the following brand drugs are available without PA.
 - Zithromax 250mg & 500mg tablets, Zithromax 1gm packet and Zithromax 100mg & 200mg suspensions (change made effective 4/1/20)

The following change has been made since market availability of Flovent HFA (the preferred HFA product in the Inhaled Corticosteroids Therapeutic Class) has been restored.

\circ Asmanex HFA requires PA (change made effective 5/1/20)
