MEDICAID FEE FOR SERVICE (FFS) MOSQUITO REPELLENT COVERAGE

Effective **September 1, 2016,** NYS FFS Medicaid will provide coverage for mosquito repellent when prescribed to enrollees who intend to travel to, or return from a Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recognized area of localized Zika transmission as reported here: <u>http://www.cdc.gov/zika/geo/united-states.html</u>.

Currently, per the CDC, there are no known locally transmitted cases in New York State. To prevent the Zika virus from spreading, NYS Medicaid FFS will pay for mosquito repellent until the CDC states that there is no longer a risk.

Consistent with Medicaid policy for coverage of non-prescription items, a fiscal order, which includes all the same information contained on a prescription, is required. Some examples of covered items that have been evaluated for effectiveness by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), and approved for use by the CDC are listed below. Pharmacies may bill using the National Drug Codes (NDCs) provided, which have been derived by First Data Bank using the Universal Product Code (UPC).
