### **Get Ready!** **Quick and Easy Practitioner Enrollment** **Coming in September!**

Beginning in September, individual **practitioners** new to the New York State (NYS) Medicaid program (i.e., never before enrolled) will be able to apply for enrollment utilizing a new enrollment portal – the **NYS Medicaid Provider Services Portal**. Individual practitioners applying for Medicaid enrollment, and credentialing staff who prepare practitioner applications, must create NY.Gov Business Accounts prior to accessing the portal to complete and submit applications.

By creating a NY.Gov Business Account, practitioners and authorized credentialing staff will be able to access the NYS Medicaid Provider Services Portal to view and control the provider's enrollment record, including if the provider:

- Separates from their current employer and credentialing support team,
- Authorizes a second credentialing team from another employer to access their enrollment file,
- Wishes to review the status of their application, and/or
- Is ready to digitally attest and submit an application.

**New practitioner enrollment** is the first phase of an exciting project to modernize the NYS enrollment process! More provider types will be added to the portal as the project rolls out future phases, but all providers and credentialing staff will be required to create NY.Gov Business Accounts.

Similar to the way in which a NY.Gov *Personal* Account is needed to use MyDMV when renewing a driver's license or registration, a Ny.Gov *Business* Account is needed to use the NYS Medicaid Provider Services Portal when applying for enrollment or updating an enrollment file. Be sure to visit the [NYGOVID Account Overview Guide](#) and follow the steps to create an account. This only needs to be done once and can be done from a desktop, laptop, tablet and phone!

Be ready to enroll when the portal is ready for you! Don't forget to watch for communications announcing portal availability for more providers and more enrollment functions!
